FINDING YOUR CEREMONY SITE

Whether you plan to do it in the corner of a restaurant or in a Greek Orthodox church, the space requires careful consideration.

Are there restrictions on music choice? Some places require you to use the church's organ player rather than your own outside musicians.		
Are there any rules on amplification of sound?		
Are there any restrictions on lights or where they can be set up?		
■ For a religious venue, are there any restrictions regarding clothing (e.g., arms and shoulders covered)? What about head coverings?		
What will I need to provide for the ceremony?

Are there any restrictions on how a chuppah or altar is decorated?		
Are there extra fees, such as for music?		
■ Is there a suggested donation for the minister, priest, or rabbi?

Does the church parking lot require a traffic officer? Is there a fee?		
Can we offer water or non- alcoholic drinks before and after the ceremony?		
If there is an outdoor element, what's Plan B in case of bad weather?		
How much time do we have to clean-up after the ceremony?		
Some will require same-day clean-up.		
Are there any rules or restrictions I haven't covered that I should know about?
